OPEN SPACE, PUBLIC REALM & STREETSCAPE

- Improved communication between City and State about AB green spaces

- Include new storm water guidelines in development reviews & new streets, street re-building
- Front Yard Parking, ISD enforcement

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

 - Health scholarships for nursing programs
 - Elder Center (recreation)
 - Wellness program for kids, Brighton HS
 - Career development around allied health professions
 - Look at Franscician Children's Hospital
 - Internships
 - Services for all ages
- Steady stream of \$ based on SF for public realm + open space improvements
- Ensure that programs are long-term, not short term and funding dependent.
 - Partnerships with city, not just w/ groups
- Inspectional Services Department
 - Less cops, more ISD! *
 - Basement Ban
 - o Promote it legally and safely
 - Have the university's give space
 - o More affordable housing
- More partnerships with city agencies and community organizations
 - Get people who live here more involved
 - Improve local schools with the help of institutions *
