COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT

(2) Public schools—lots of neighborhood resources, partnerships *

- More equity for institutions across neighborhood
- Mailing addresses available to community groups to help with outreach on community projects
 - Help people connect with each other
 - o Partnership with local newspaper
- ISD enforcement
 - Front yard paving
 - o Boarding/over-occupying
 - o Late night noise
 - o Lots can be done by enforcing what already exists
 - o Landlords taking advantage of tenants (heating, bedbugs, etc.)
- Neighborhood-wide website—one-stop shopping
- Student residences—frat houses
- How to turn students into assets—engage them in the community, start with housing quality
- Annual festivals—shut-down street:
 - o Brian Honan Road Race
 - o Boston Shines
 - o \$ from Main Streets

(1) Community center/youth programs *

- We need one
- o Need after-school care
- Health care \$
 - o Joseph Smith H.C.
- Affordable recreation space
- Problems with activities for young people—more/better after-school programs
- Public Art A/B doesn't have much
- Sex offender registry—police response

MAIN STREETS & BUSINESS DEVELOPMENT

- Promote local businesses
 - o Need a bookstore
 - More city support to Brighton Main Streets program
 - Too much time spent raising money
 - Expand/new Chestnut Hill Ave/Main Streets Cleveland Circle
- Cleveland Circle
 - o City help get a good business use (bookstore, café...not a bar)
- Small businesses closing
 - o Union Square (high rents)
- Economic bleed to Cambridge/Somerville/malls
- Coolidge Corner model—replicate
 - Density of businesses
 - Mix of businesses
 - o Taccess
 - o Expand parking—enforcement of double parking and bus stops

- Allston Village
 - o Too many restaurants

(1) Better mix of stores *

- City small business start-up assistance
 - o City not responsive
- More municipal parking lots
 - o Mandate developers to create them
- Brighton Mills/Western Ave
 - o Could have commercial district, but too much vacant
- Mixed-use development
 - Stacked business/residential
 - Stacked businesses
- Crime
 - o High burglary rate
 - o Hate crimes—immigrants
 - o Pedestrian safety...transportation
 - Cleveland Circle, etc.
 - Packard's Corner
 - Union Square
 - Wash/Foster
 - o Graffiti/vandalism
- Trash on streets, especially business areas
- Street cleaning—expand?
- Transfer budget
 - o Snow ←→ Trash, Street Cleaning
- Beautifying store facades
- Need for clothing, etc. substitute for Kmart
 - CompUSA → ??
 - o Find the right mix
 - o WGBH → restaurants?

(2) Streetscape *

- Walking more enjoyable
- Benches
- o Wide pedestrian sidewalks
- o Signage
- o Art
- Store clustering—similar businesses next door
- Allston Village parking
- Residential parking used by commuters

HOUSING

- Owner occupancy
- Neighborhood trending down
- BC and Harvard impacting
- Resist increasing housing density
- Higher tax rates
- Noise-making from students—enforcement
 - o Driving families out
 - o City needs to support quality of life issues
 - o Perception driving buyers away

(1) City insists on on-campus undergraduate dorms (100%) *

o UG on-campus would make housing more affordable

(2) Police and ISD enforcement *

- Adhere to zoning
- Landlords exploiting students
 - Rates up
 - Security deposits
- ABCDC bought properties, financing requires no renting to students
 - o Replicate
- More affordable housing built by non-profits
 - o Emphasize other neighborhoods?
- Protect 1-F and 2-F houses
- Strive for good income mix among residents
- After-school programs to attract families
- Return of rent control?????
- Enforcement ISD of rental properties when turn-over
 - City accountability metrics
- Increase residential exemption

OPEN SPACE, PUBLIC REALM & STREETSCAPE

- (3) Need for dog recreation space(s)
 - o More city support
 - o Increase in dog ownership
 - Lack of public knowledge about open space
 - o Signage
 - o Private space access defined
 - o Green connections
 - o Large fraction private?
- (4) Green streets/corridors
 - o Comm. Ave.
 - o More City emphasis on Green Streets
 - City responsive, not proactive
 - Resident watering program, not City
 - NB: bicycle use integrated
 - Connections to Charles River
 - o Parsons
 - o Brook Street—DCR needs to improve
 - Capital \$ to plant street trees
 - Playing fields over-used
 - o Improve Daly Field (DCR)
 - o Rogers tennis courts usage in summer
 - o Permitting for rec. uses
 - Electronic posting on permitting
 - Permits for cutting big trees
 - Introduction of flowering species in the <u>parks</u>
- (2) More \$ to Boston Parks/DCR for capital investments *
- (1) Better ways to protect (private) open space in A-B *
