




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#### What We Heard: Open House & Question Campaign

- "Affordable to those who live here"
- "Maintain the diversity of Dorchester"
- "Make more space for people, less space for cars, to make the neighborhood more interesting"
- "Focus on pedestrian safety and access to public/green space"
- "Ensure new development has public green space"
- "Buildings will have to be climate-proofed as sea level rises and storms increase"

Create housing for a range of income levels

- Plan for a climate-resilient neighborhood
- Create safe, walkable bike-friendly streets
- Improve transit options and neighborhood connections
- Preserve and grow quality jobs
- Provide support for local businesses
- Create an active, people-centric district through development
- Support cultural diversity of the neighborhood




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#### What We Heard: Land Use Workshop

- Preserve existing residential fabric
- Housing uses along Dorchester Avenue and Freeport Street but away from the Red line train tracks
- Shopping and commercial uses along Dorchester Avenue
- 21st Century industrial and commercial uses along the track
- Provide open space links to the greater network of open spaces in area.
- Provide a variety of civic, educational, and cultural spaces to serve diverse community



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
# What We Heard: Neighborhood Character Outdoor Workshop

We heard that many participants were **enthusiastic** about:

- New open space
- Active street fronts and public realm
- Improved sidewalks and safer streets for bikers and pedestrians.

We heard that many participants were **concerned** about:

- Affordable housing
- Displacement of residents and businesses
- Traffic



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#### What We Heard: Housing Toolkit and Housing Ideas

- Workshop 1 (March '18): existing City programs and services to create income-restricted housing and to prevent displacement
- Workshop 2 (May '18): ideas to create incomerestricted housing and prevent displacement in Glover's Corner and Dorchester

  - Potential for new bus connection to Savin Hill
- Participants were concerned about:
  - Traffic impact outside of Study Area







sea level rise

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


#### **HEAT ISLAND MAP**





Some Impact to Glover's Corner



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


#### STORMWATER FLOODING MAP

More Impact to Glover's Corner



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



#### **SEA LEVEL RISE MAP**

Less Impact to Glover's Corner








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#### CASE STUDY MALMÖ, SWEDEN

Management of surface storm water through infrastructure that doubles as an urban amenity





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# **CASE STUDY**MALMÖ, SWEDEN

- Extended network of parks and green space passages
- On-site surface storm water management through courtyard ponds and open canals







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#### STORMWATER AND HEAT ISLAND MITIGATION

#### **Open Space Network**

- Linear open spaces create:
  - More porous surfaces where water can be absorbed
  - Space for underground BWSC stormwater storage
  - Network of tree canopy








#### **ROLE OF PLAN: GLOVER'S CORNER**

- Planning provides a framework for the creation of open spaces that:
  - Address needs of underserved areas, as identified by Parks Department planning
  - Ensure that open space needs of new and existing population are met
  - Augment oversubscribed existing open space resources



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#### **RECREATION & MOBILITY**

#### **Open Space Network**

- Open spaces can be multi-purpose:
  - Recreational opportunities
  - Walking and biking facilities
  - Green links to adjacent open space/parks

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
