
Roxbury Cultural District

- City staff sit on boards to facilitate securing resources

Ruggles Gateway and Choice Neighborhood Funds



- City is investing \$4M+ for Ruggles St road and sidewalk improvements
- \$680,000 in CNI funding will go towards art installations and other streetscape enhancements including wayfinding, street furniture, banners etc.
- Dewitt/Ruggles Park will see \$1.6M in improvements through CNI and City funding



Dudley Branch Library







- \$17.2M complete renovation
- Massachusetts Board of Library Commissioners has approved a \$5.6M grant for the project.
- In construction, anticipated completion Fall 2019
- Project includes:
 - Complete renovation to interior spaces
 - New demonstration kitchen
 - Dedicated space for an African American collection
 - Reader's porch and new plaza
 - "Percent for Art" installation

Bruce C. Bolling Municipal Building





- \$123.9M construction of new building to house BPS Central Office
- Opened April 2015
- New Home to 500+ employees of the Boston Public Schools
- Project includes:
 - a new collaborative, flexible work environment
 - flexible technological infrastructure that will adapt to future technology needs
 - multiple community meeting spaces
 - 18,000 square feet of mixed use retail on first floor
- Roxbury Innovation Center 3,000 square feet dedicated on the second floor
- New businesses include Soleil and Jazz Urbane

Dearborn 6-12 STEM Academy





- \$73.5M new construction
- Project is complete, and opened for students in September 2018
- Anticipate \$37.3M MSBA reimbursement, approximately 50% of project costs
- The new Dearborn focuses on a project-based learning curriculum, with an emphasis on STEM education.
- The newly constructed School includes:
 - Collaborative workspaces
 - A "Fab Lab" with welding booth
 - Outdoor classroom
 - Media and Information Technology Center where students can explore computer animation and digital design.

Vine Street Community Center





- \$5.3M interior renovation
- Project is complete, and re-opened in fall 2018
- Project Includes:
 - Reconfigured layout to accommodate updated community needs including new fitness center and recording studio
 - Upgraded exterior lighting provides more security to building and surrounding neighborhood
 - New Central Air system, Vine St is a cooling center and an evacuation center

Beautification Efforts

- New banner signage for lamp posts
- Flowers and plantings
- Power washing and general clean up

Public Works

- Full time Summer Hokie maintaining the cleanliness of Dudley Square
- Additional Dudley Square street cleaning every morning
- Additional BigBelly Smart Solution trash cans installed
- Additional waste collection shifts for more routine maintenance within Dudley Square

Dudley Complete Streets Phase I

 Reconstructs Dudley Street and Warren Street from Washington Street to Kearsage including streetscape for the new Dudley Library.


- New traffic and pedestrian signals, street trees, sidewalks, bike path, and

streetlights.

- Over \$5 million total investment

Begins construction this Spring






Dudley Complete Streets

Dudley Complete Streets Phase II

- Reconstructs remaining streets around the Square including Washington Street, Roxbury Street, Warren Street, and Shawmut/Malcolm X Intersection
- New traffic and pedestrian signals, street trees, sidewalks, bike lanes, and streetlights.
- Over \$6 million total investment
- Approaching 100% Design
- Construction beginning 2020




Melnea Cass Boulevard

Melnea Cass Boulevard Design & Reconstruction

- Reconstructs corridor from Columbus Ave to Mass Ave
- Installs new traffic and pedestrian signals including protected and raised intersections
- Builds new sidewalk and grade separated cycle track including new pedestrian and roadway streetlighting
- Plants over 250 new trees including stormwater infiltration
- Over \$28 million total investment (City,State,Fed)
- Approaching 100% Design/Acquisition of ROW
- Project Bid August 2019
- Construction beginning 2020



Blight Enforcement

- Landlord meeting organized to address neighborhood issuesincluding blight
- 2249-2259 Washington St
 - Boston Fire Department took the property owner to court over life safety concerns
 - The judge in the case appointed a receiver
 - City staff has been in communication with both the owner and court appointed receiver to ensure they're aware of the community's concerns and desired outcomes for the property

As of April 2019, the judge has imposed 3 deadlines:

New roof installed by end of April '19 - completed Storefronts rebuilt by end of May '19 New sprinkler system installed by end of June '19 Mayor Walsh speaking to a resident in front of 2249 Washington St



Public Safety, Public Health, and Recovery **Services Interventions**



Recovery Services

- Ongoing partnership with Dudley Square Library to provide technical assistance and training to staff
- Weekly street-based harm reduction outreach offering naloxone, access to treatment, and connection to medical services
- Regular Mobile Sharps Team presence to pick up and properly dispose of used syringes
- Kraft Multi-service Van



Public Safety

- Latest updates from Boston Police Department
 - On 4-27-19 a walking beat was added to the patrol area
 - On 5-3-19 a Sgt with an anti-crime car was added to the Dudley patrol area
- Latest update from Boston Public School efforts
 - BPS Police Officer dedicated to Dudley Sq. Mon-Fri 8am-5pm
- Latest update from BCYF Street Workers efforts
 - Four (4) Six (6) Street Workers dedicated to Dudley Sq.

Development Activities

(both public and private)



- Tremont Crossing (Parcel 3) has final designation and pre-development construction activities should begin on the site in the coming weeks
- Recent project completions on public land include:
 - Affordable Housing at Parcel 10 (Madison Tropical)
 - Marriott Hotel and Residences at Parcel 9
 - Bartlett Place

Melnea Hotel and Residences

- The development pipeline includes over 2000 new units, including at least 900 affordable units. A few highlights include:
 - Rio Grande 34,220 sq feet and 241 rental units (48 affordable units)
 - 10 Taber Street 46,239 sq feet with 45 homeownership units (6 affordable homeownership units)
 - 3 projects on Bartlett Yard, including rental, commercial and senior supportive housing
 - 38 new rental and homeownership units on Highland/Marcella, including 23 affordable


- BHA Whittier CHOICE Update
 - Whittier Phase 1 (POAH/BHA) is on track for completion and rent-up in November 2019
 - Whittier Phase 2 construction start is planned for January 2020
 - Whittier Phase 3 is in design phase, for projected construction start in 2021.
 - Madison Melnea Cass (Madison Park Development Corp.) will be complete and rented up in May-June 2019
 - Whittier Homebuying Club established to help residents of Whittier and Madison Park transition from affordable rental housing to homeownership.
