Public Realm Flexible Fund

Harvard is proposing a \$3.6M public realm flexible fund - an increase of \$1.6M to the university's original proposal – to support additional parks and open space improvements, neighborhood beautification projects, and transportation and roadway improvements in North Allston-Brighton.

Projects are intended to be public improvements that would otherwise be the responsibility of Harvard University. Projects will be identified, reviewed and selected through consultation between the Task Force, community, Harvard and the BRA. Programs will be approved by the City of and Boston and Harvard University and implemented by appropriate City or state agencies.

The public realm flexible fund will include:

- Contribution to the Parks and Recreation Smith Field Master Plan budget for programming specific to the Allston-Brighton community
- The repurposed \$350,000 Holton/Everett Street signalization
- Other examples of previously identified projects by Task Force and community such as park or playground repairs or upgrades, streetscape improvements on Lincoln and Cambridge Streets, signage related to public safety or local business districts.
