I'd like to lend my support to the proposed Boston Garden/80 Causeway Street project. This development will fill in the huge void left by the old Boston Garden site, which would be a welcome addition to a new revitalized waterfront skyline. For too long, motorists and waterfront residents have had to look at a gaping hole completely encircled by brand new, beautiful architecture, most namely the iconic Zakim Bridge. With the economy finally rebounding after the 2008 recession, it's encouraging to finally see this project gain some traction.

What excites me most are the proposals of new retail use as well as traffic upgrades. For many years, the residents of the North End and West End have been in dire need of a supermarket in this area.
