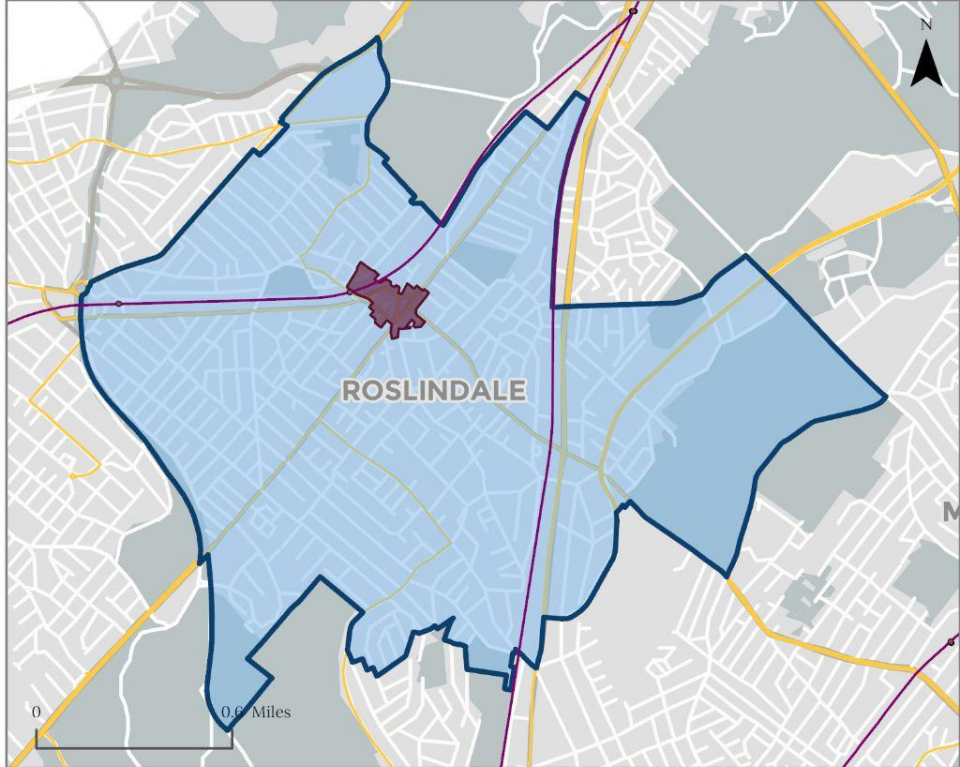

Roslindale is a diverse neighborhood with strong Hispanic and Black communities, characterized by family households and high homeownership

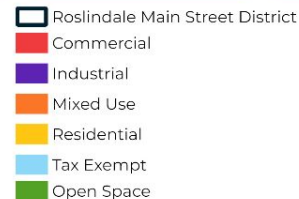
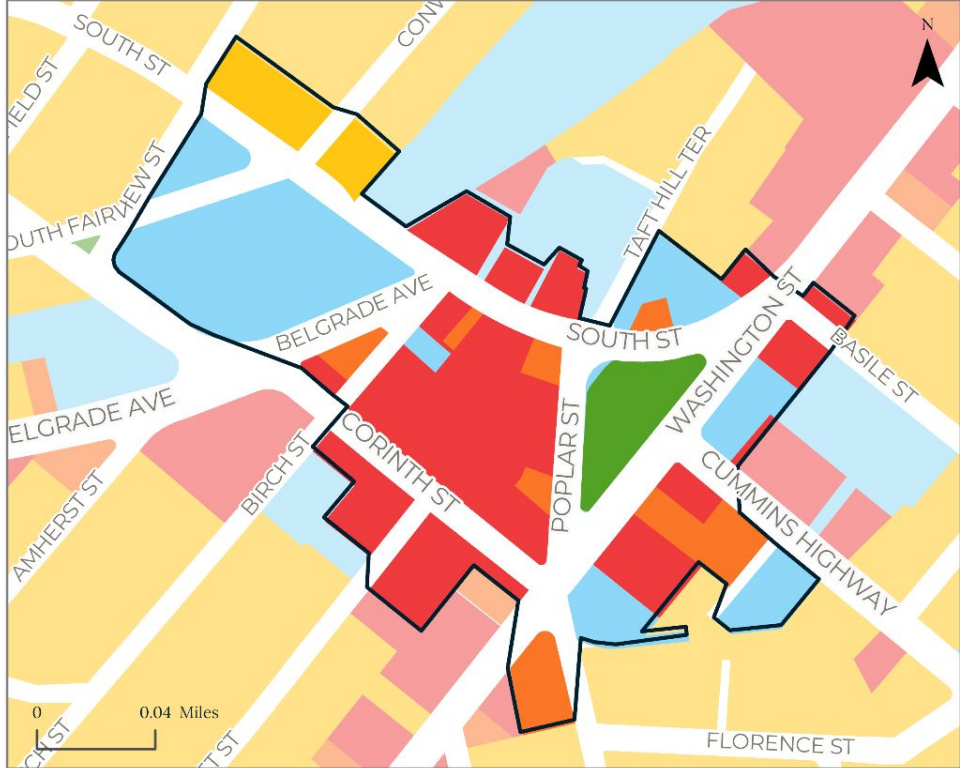
- 26% are aged 60+

- 72% of households are family households
- 59% of households are owner occupied
- 87% of households own a vehicle

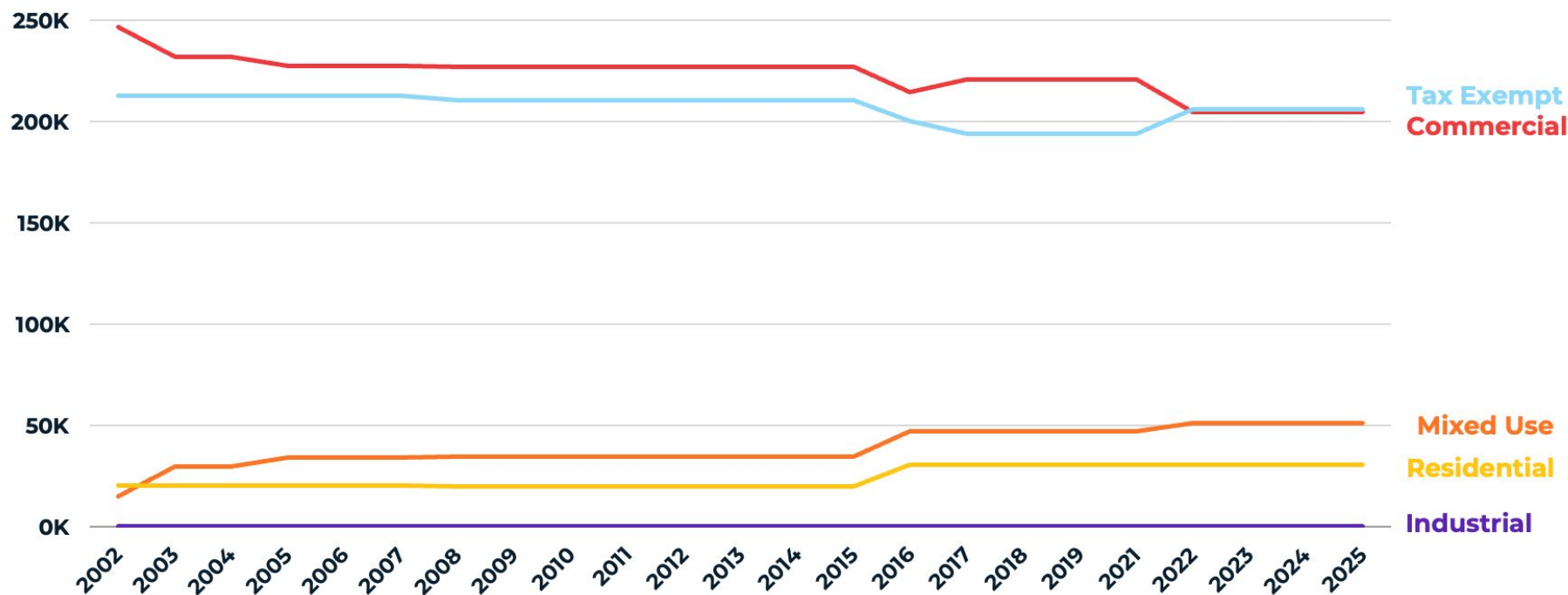

Commercial land use has slightly decreased over time while residential and mixed use have increased

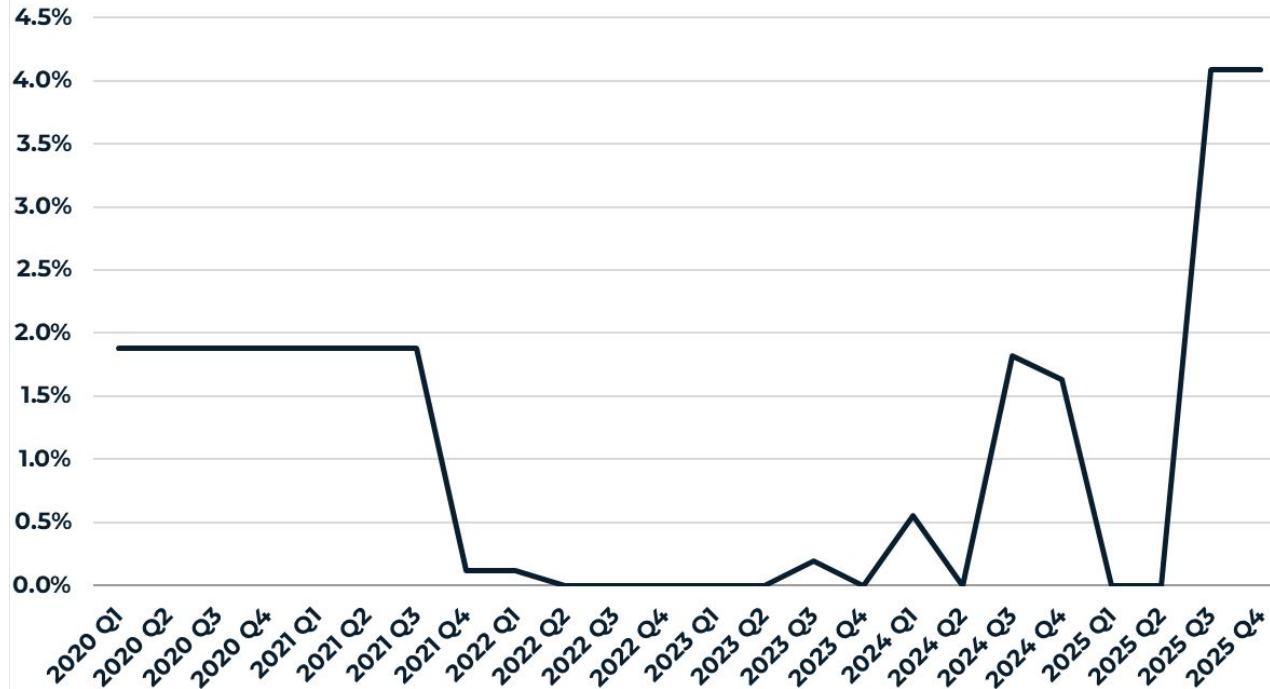
Square Feet of Parcel Land Area by Category in Roslindale Village Main Streets District by Fiscal Year, 2002-2025

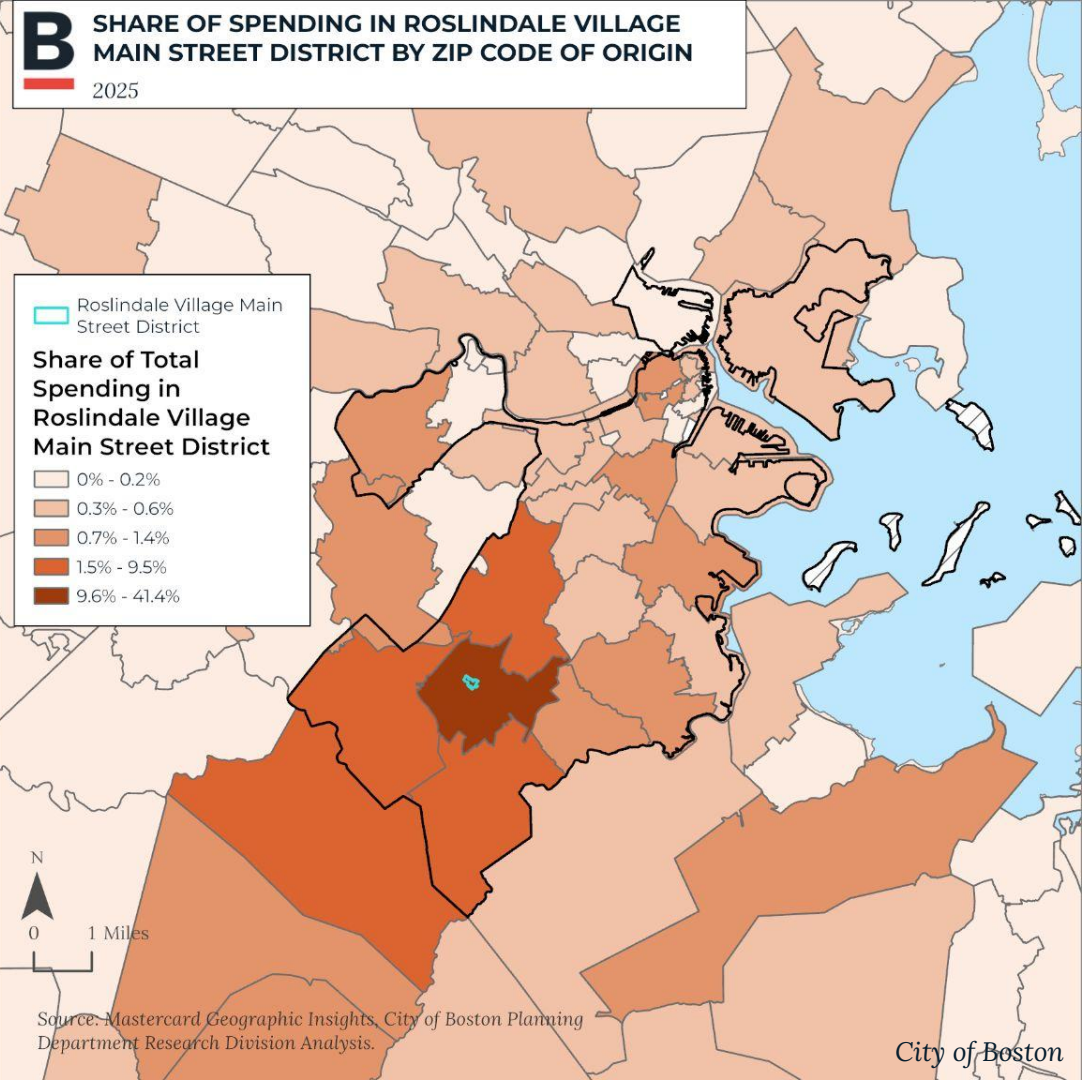
Roslindale Village Main Streets payroll employment is concentrated in Administration & Support, Waste Management and Remediation, Accommodation and Food Services, and Retail Trade



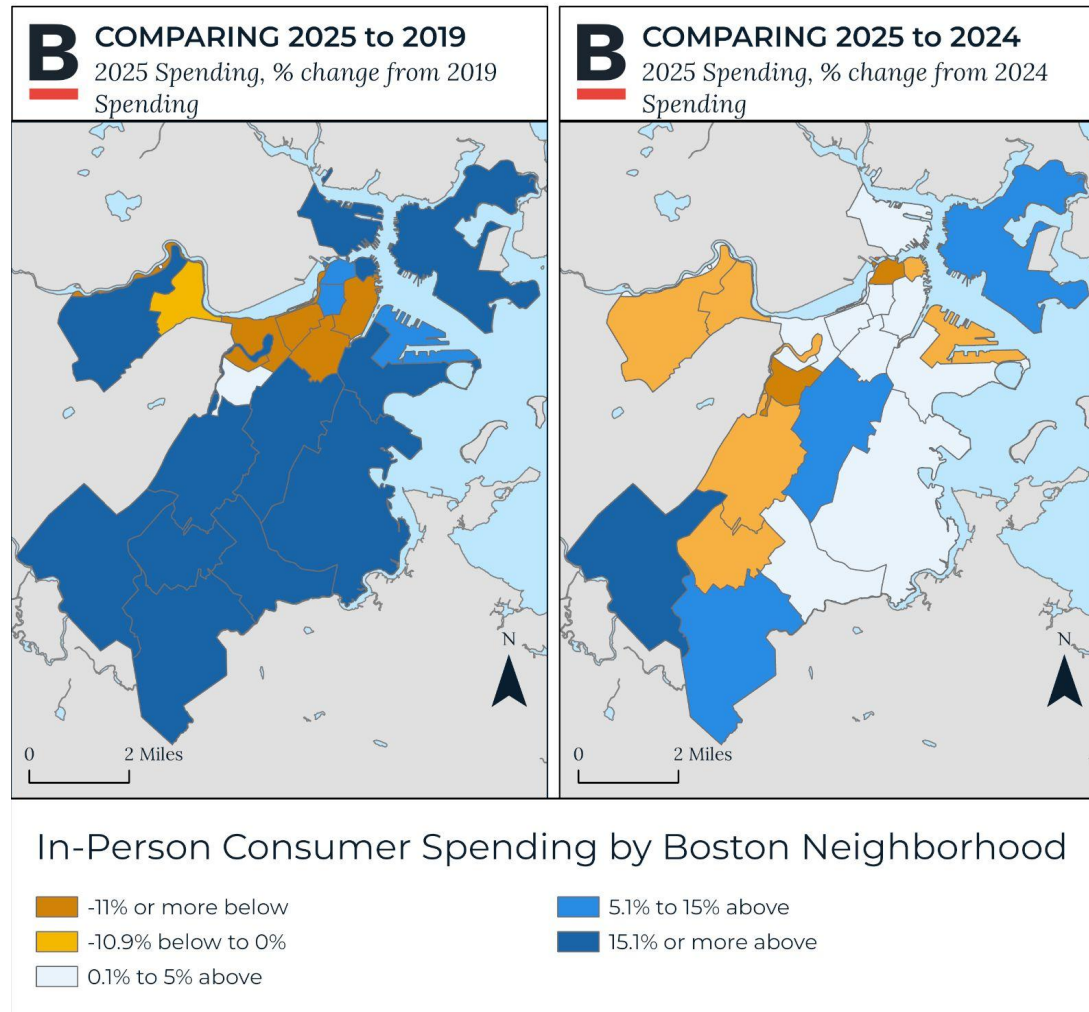

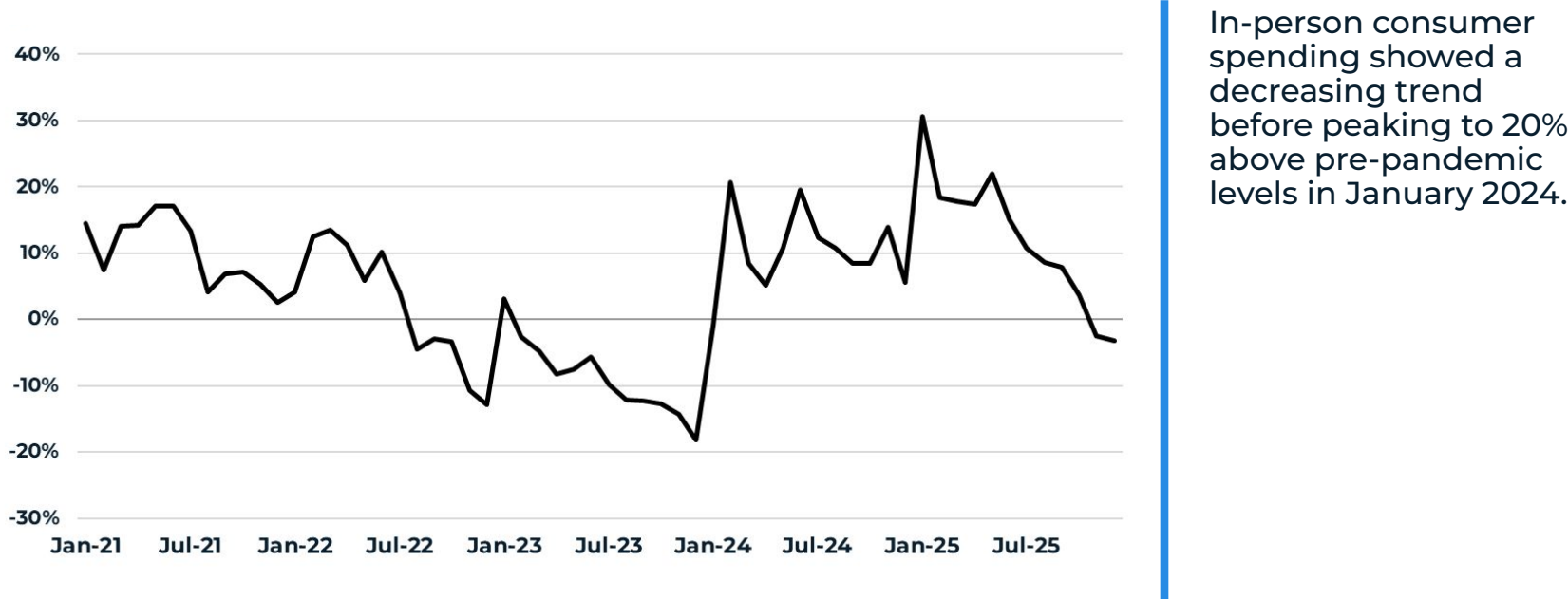
In 2025, consumer spending in Roslindale was 0.6% below 2024 levels and 24.3% above 2019 levels when adjusted for inflation.

Consumer spending transaction counts experienced significant increase since early 2024

Total In-Person Transaction Counts in Roslindale Village Main Streets District, Jan 2021 - Dec 2025, Percentage Change from Same Month in 2019

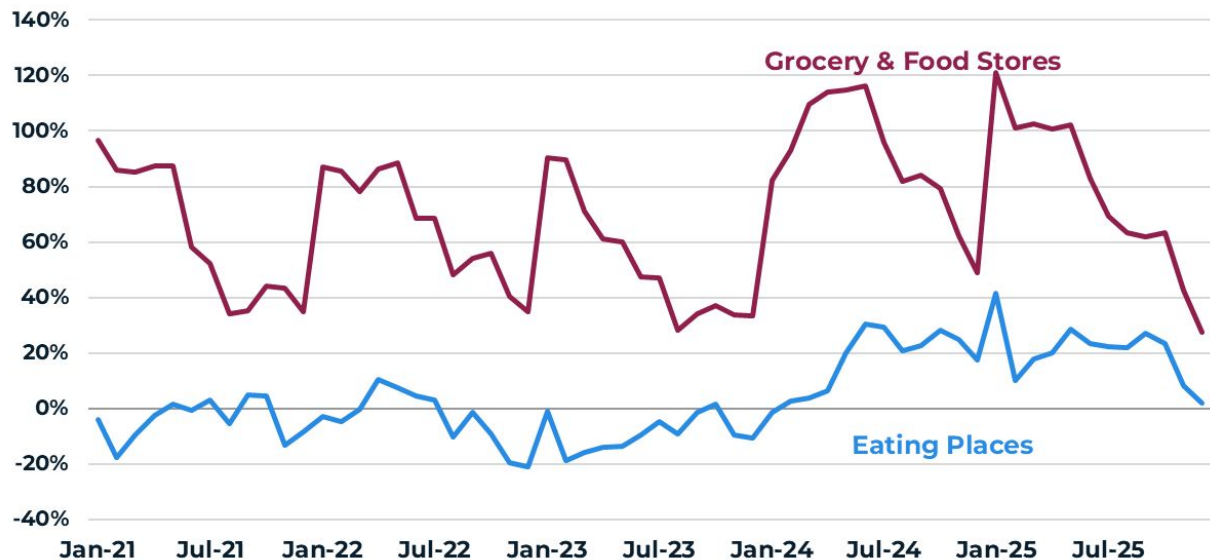


In-person transaction volumes fluctuate before experiencing strong growth in January 2024, eventually peaking at $\approx 60\%$ above pre-pandemic levels by early 2025.

While grocery spending fluctuated without a clear upward or downward trend, restaurant spending showed a consistent upward trajectory

Grocery spending fluctuates but stayed well above 2019 levels throughout the period.

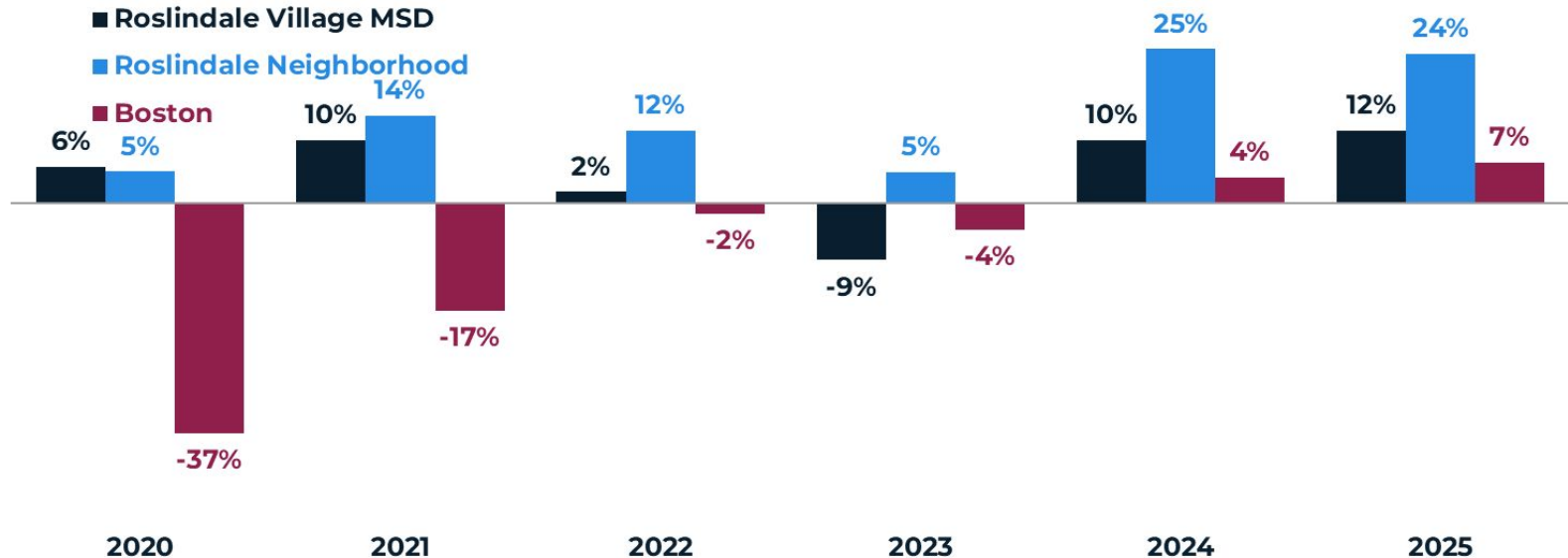
Restaurant spending started below 2019 levels, but showed a steady increase, eventually rising above those levels by 2024.

Total In-Person Consumer Spending, Percentage Change from 2019

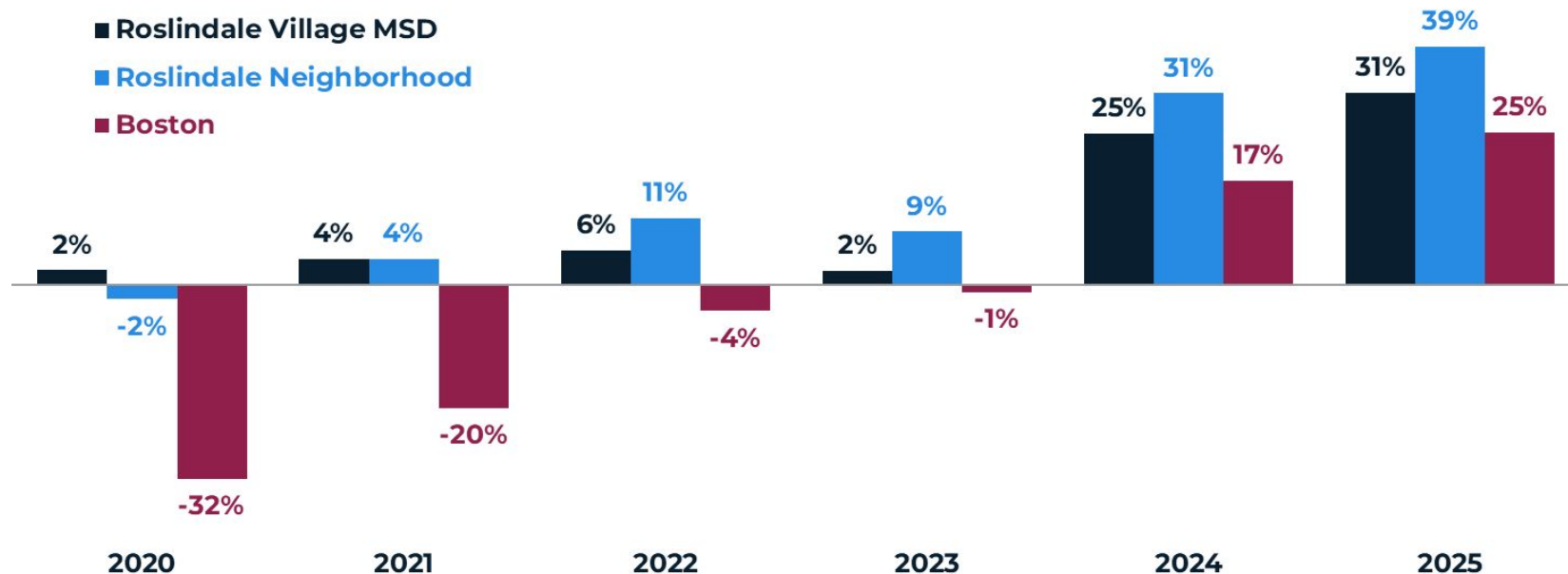

Total In-Person Transaction Counts, Percentage Change from 2019

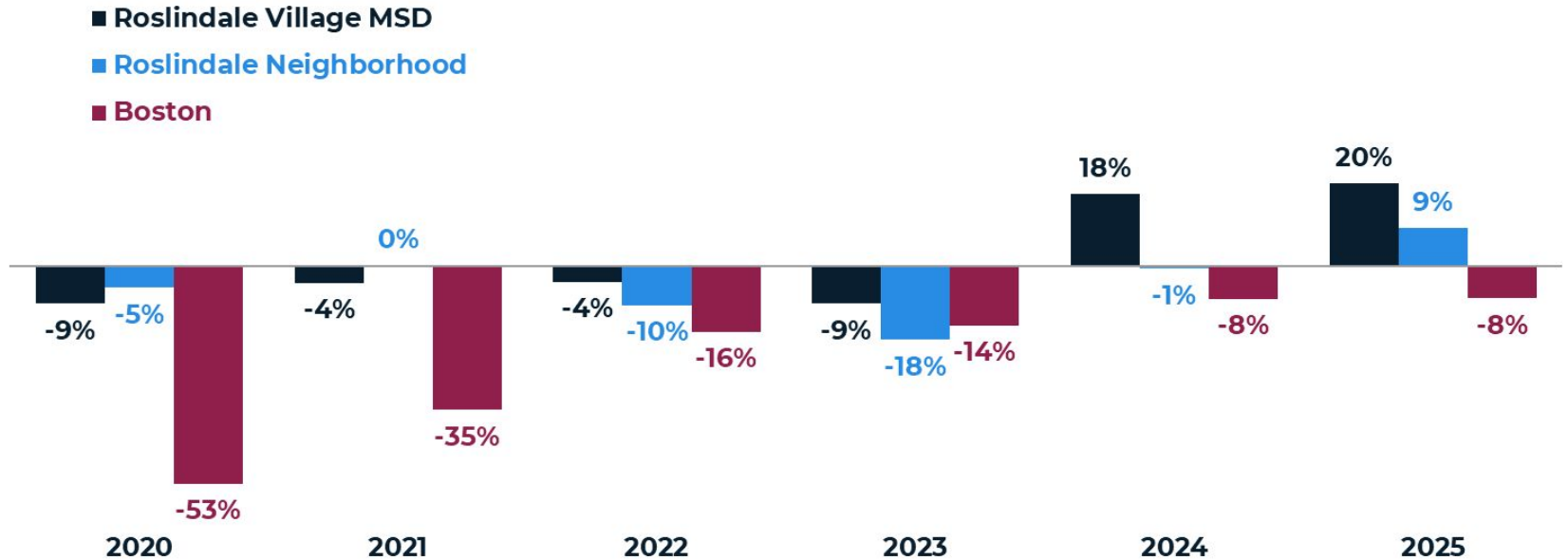

Total Restaurant In-Person Consumer Spending, Percentage Change from 2019

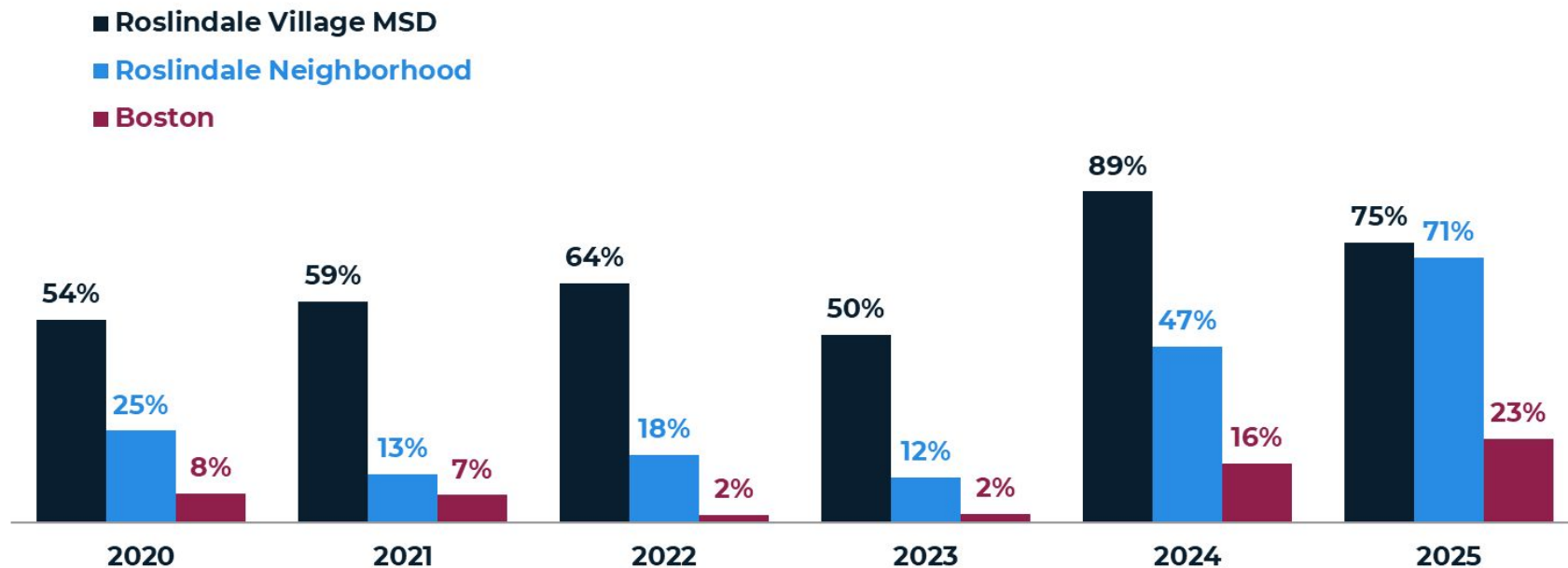

Total Grocery In-Person Consumer Spending, Percentage Change from 2019

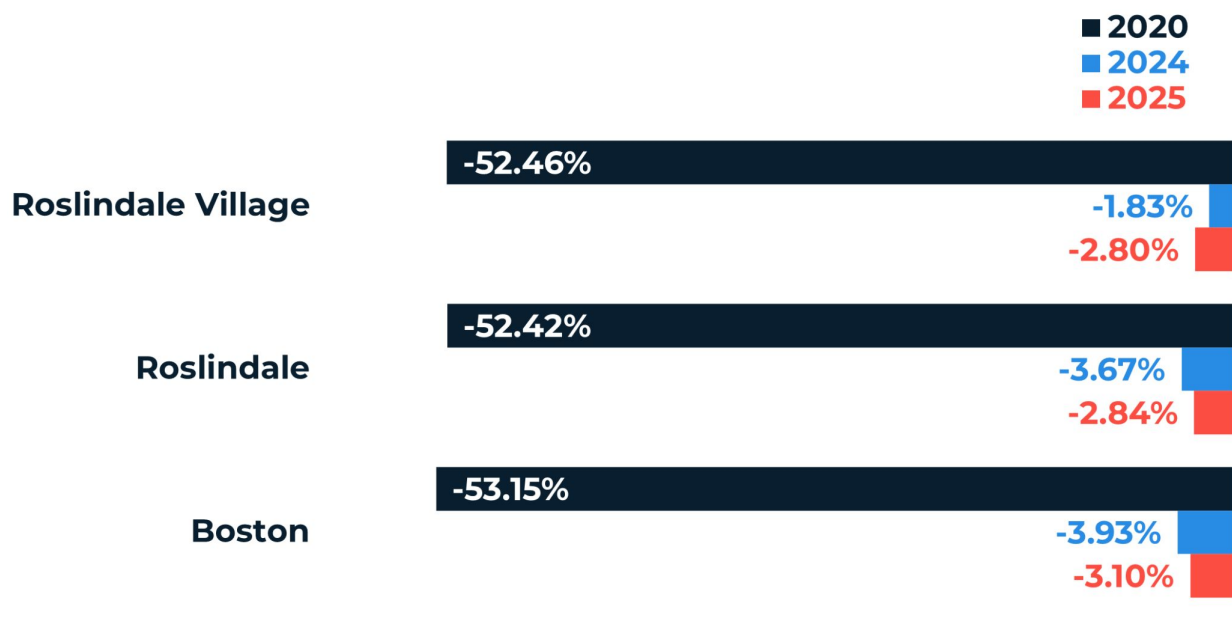

While visits to Roslindale Village in 2025 nearly recovered to pre-pandemic levels, they decreased slightly relative to 2024

Annual Visits* to Roslindale Village Main Street, Roslindale Neighborhood, and Boston Compared to Visits in 2019



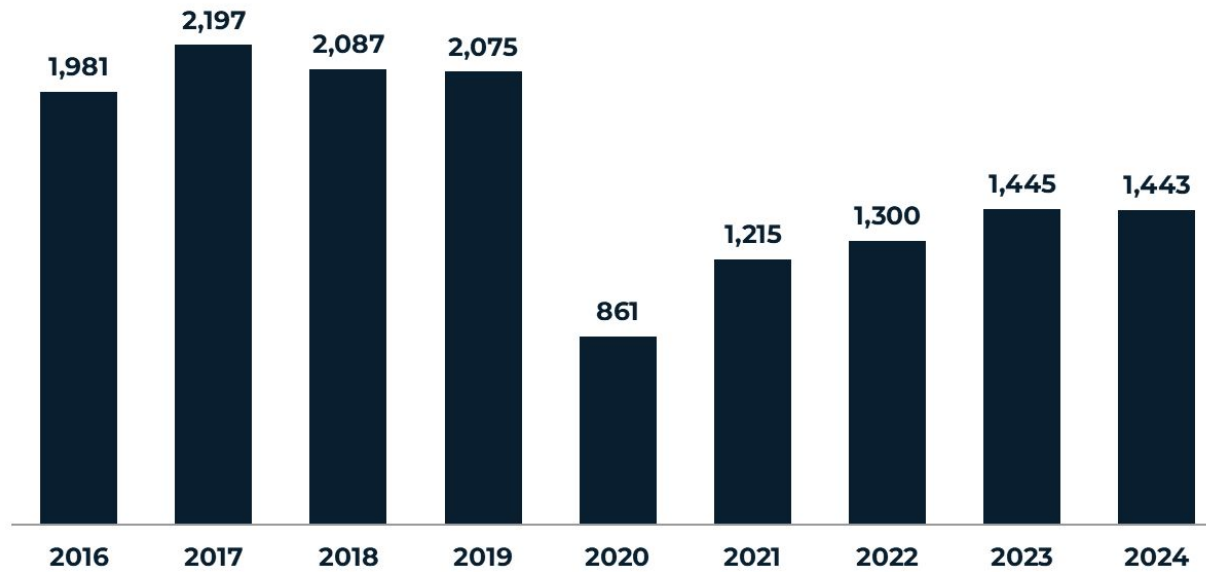
In 2020, visits to **Roslindale Main Street** were 52.46% lower than in the pre-pandemic year, 2019.

By 2025, visits to **Roslindale Main Street** recovered to just 2.80% below 2019 levels.
