

Boston's Resident Labor Force

Employment


- Boston's resident labor force grew by 19.2% from 2000 to 2012.
- Recessions in 2001 and 2008 have lead to the unemployed population in Boston to increase by 58.6% since 2000.



Note: ACS unemployment rates tend to be higher than official unemployment estimates; however, the advantage of using the ACS is we are able to compare unemployment rates across a multitude of groups.


Labor Force Characteristics

- > Young workers make up a larger portion of the unemployed than employed.
- The ratio of males to females that are employed is nearly 1:1; however, there are fewer unemployed females than unemployed males.




Race and Ethnicity of Boston's Labor Force

- Nearly two-thirds of unemployed Boston residents are non-white.
- Over one-third of the unemployed Boston residents are Black or African American.



Educational Attainment for the Population 25-64 Years

- > The majority of Boston's civilian labor force has a bachelors degree or higher.
- While 54% of employed Boston residents have a college degree, only 27% of the unemployed have a college degree.



Boston's Workers by Place of Residence

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
Race and Ethnicity of Boston Workers by Residence

• There are more non-white Boston workers living in the city than commuting from outside Boston.




Citizenship of Boston Workers by Residence

Boston has more workers who are foreign born living in the city than living outside the city.



Educational Attainment of Boston Workers by Residence

- > 43.4% of Boston workers living in Boston have a high school or associates degree.
- > There are more Boston workers with a Bachelor's degree or higher living outside the city.
