## Boston's Poverty Trends:

## - Increasing Rates

- The total number of people living in poverty grew by 7,036 from 102,092 to 109,128 and the poverty rate rose from $18.7 \%$ to $19.5 \%$.
- The number of elderly living in poverty grew by 1,046 from 9,386 to 10,432 , raising their poverty rate from $15.3 \%$ to 1
- The increase in elderly living in poverty represented $14.9 \%$ of the total growth in persons living in poverty
- Most of the increase in poverty in the city came from individuals 18 to 64 years old, where the number living in poverty grew by 6,863 persons, but because of the simultaneous rise in total 18 to 64 age population, the corresponding poverty rate advanced only slightly from $15.6 \%$ to $16.8 \%$.


## Children under 18 living in poverty

- Decreased slightly by 894 from 29,822 to 28,928, and for children under 18 the rate decreased from $28.0 \%$ to $25.6 \%$.
- School age children aged 5 to 17 living in poverty increased slightly by 979 from 20,083 to 21,062, though their poverty rate dropped from $28.1 \%$ to $25.7 \%$.


## Families living in poverty

- Relatively stable with a slight increase of 294 , from 17,598 to 17,982 and a poverty rate from $15.0 \%$ to $15.3 \%$.
- Families with children living in poverty also remained relatively stable with a small decline of 169 from 13,980 to 13,8* while the poverty rate declined from $23.9 \%$ to $22.2 \%$.

Single parent families in poverty headed by females

- Decreased by 490 from 11,765 to 11,275 and the poverty rate dropped from $31.1 \%$ to $29.0 \%$.
- Those with children under 18 also dropped by 753 from 10,554 to 9,801 and the poverty rate slid from $44.4 \%$ to $37.4 \%$.
- Those with children under 5 dropped by 1,139 from 5,688 to 4,549 and the poverty rate dropped sharply from $54.6 \%$ to $45.6 \%$.
