### Advisory Group Roles, Responsibilities, & Objectives

The Advisory Group (AG) will assist the Boston Planning & Development Agency (BPDA) and other City agencies in creating a long-term vision for the PLAN: Downtown initiative. The primary goal of the study will be to develop a new framework for the preservation, enhancement, and growth of the Downtown area of the City of Boston, while balancing the importance of livability, daylight, walkability, climate change, access to open space, affordability, and a dynamic mix of uses, among others.

Members of the AG should attend all public working sessions and meetings during the duration of the planning process. Between public meetings, there will be AG-specific meetings in which all members should attend and participate. Advisory Group meetings are open to the public and are also an opportunity for deeper conversation with members.

### **Advisory Group Objectives**

- To be an ambassador for the community
- To promote excellence in planning, urban design, and development
- To provide deep understanding and expertise about planning issues specific to Downtown Boston
- To be a sounding board for the community's needs and aspirations
- To be a solution generator

### Advisory Group Roles + Responsibilities

- Assist with outreach and spreading the word about the planning initiative.
- Encourage excitement and participation around planning for the future.
- Communicate information back to neighborhood groups and other affiliations.
- Assist with facilitation of PLAN: Downtown events.
- Advise on the planning process and Downtown-specific issues.
- Bring topical expertise and perspective to discussions, work sessions & meetings.
- Review the consultant's tasks and findings.
- Participate in the development of a vision, goals, and principles for the future of Downtown Boston.
- Assess development scenarios and their associated impacts.
- Propose viable recommendations that will ultimately inform new urban design and development guidelines and potential zoning regulations.



## Advisory Group Roles, Responsibilities, & Objectives

### Advisory Group Time Commitment and Term of Service

- Members will remain active for the entirety of the planning process.
- The time commitment is approximately one meeting every 4–6 weeks through summer 2020. Meetings will last 1.5–2 hours, depending on the agenda.
- Members are expected to be active participants at all PLAN: Downtown events.

### **Rules of Engagement**

- This Advisory Group is specific to the PLAN: Downtown process.
- All meetings are open to the public and sponsored by the BPDA.
- Members agree to treat all participants of the study with respect and actively listen.
- Actively support all voices so that they may be heard.
- State comments and questions plainly and up-front followed by any necessary commentary.
