
Ronan Park is expansive, with views of Dorchester Bay, youth and local artists have explored visions to create a sense of place and entrances and rest areas where it is missing today.











Hero Square is the centerpoint of Fields Corner, but feels more like a pass through space than a place to rest or see local cultural and small business activity despite recent investments.



Encourage Affordable Housing




Produce new housing by rezoning areas with good transit access across Boston

WHAT WE'VE HEARD


Since the initiative launched in May of 2024, the Fields Corner Squares + Streets team has heard from and collaborated with community members to understand the existing assets and needs in Fields Corner and to create and document ideas for the future. Community ideas and City of Boston tools are shown together in the Focus Areas and Toolkit. STEP 1: CHOOSE A FOCUS AREA

Squares + Street initiatives focus on investments and change that can be achieved within 10 years. To help make sure recommendations are specific and implementable, the plan will focus on a few focus areas. The focus areas shown here are based on community priorities identified through engagements and analysis.

STEP 2: SELECT FROM THE TOOLKIT

Each tool in the toolkit represents an idea from the community or from City staff to achieve the community vision for each focus area in Fields Corner. The tools are ideas for buildings, the public realm, travel, and open space. We are asking you to prioritize the ideas that would be most impactful to you within a specific focus area and to tell us why they would make a difference.

Use your worksheet as you go through each of the topics to document what is most important to you and why. City staff are available to answer questions and discuss the Focus Areas and Toolkit.
