
### **Historical Trends in Fenway**

- The population grew by 6.8% and occupied housing units decreased by 6.4% from 2000 to 2015.
- Payroll jobs in Fenway increased by 16% from 2011 to 2014.
- The owner-occupancy rate in Fenway has remained at 11-12% since 2000.
- The share of Fenway households with cars has fallen from 53% in 2000 to 33% in 2015.
- The foreign born share of Fenway's population rose from 22% in 2000 to 25% in 2015.
- From 2000 to 2015 the share of Fenway adults with at least a Bachelor's degree grew from 66% to 74%.

### The Future for Fenway


 Fenway's growth is poised to continue, with 2,126 new units of housing approved for construction between 2010 and 2016.

## **People**


### **Population Growth**

- Fenway had 32,210 residents in 2015, 5% of Boston's total population.<sup>1</sup>
- Fenway's population grew by 6.8% from 2000 to 2015, compared to the city's growth of 10%.

### Age Distribution

- Only 1.6% of Fenway residents were school-age children in 2015, compared to 12% of the Boston population.
- Fenway's share of 18-24 year olds is triple that of Boston as a whole.


# Fenway & Boston Residents by Age 2015



#### Diversity

- About 25% of Fenway residents were foreign born in 2015, about the same as the 27% citywide share.
- About 19% of Fenway residents were Asian/Pacific Islander in 2015, a higher share than Boston (9%).

## **Economy**

#### lobs

- Fenway had 16,126 payroll jobs in 2014, 28% of which are in Accommodation and Food Services.<sup>2</sup>
- Fenway has 0.5 payroll jobs for every resident worker, and 2% of the payroll jobs in Boston.


#### **Labor Force**

- Fenway's resident labor force had 17,766 people in 2015, 4.7% of Boston's resident labor force.
- 56% of Fenway residents age 16 and over participate in the labor force, lower than Boston's 68% labor participation rate.
- The top occupations for residents of Fenway in 2015: Office and Administrative support, Education, Training, and Library occupations, and Business and Finance.

#### Education

- 66% of Fenway residents were enrolled in college or university in 2015, a higher share than the city as a whole (17%).
- In 2015, 74% of Fenway residents age 25 and older had a Bachelor's degree, higher than the 45% of Boston residents.

#### Income

 The median household income in Fenway in 2015 was \$34,483, lower than the Boston median of \$55,777.


### **Place**

#### Households

 57% of Fenway residents live in households, only 15% of which are families. The remaining population lives in dorms or other institutions.




#### **Renters and Owners**

- In 2015, Fenway had 3,422 condos, 26% of which were owner occupied.<sup>3</sup>
- Fenway's median rent in 2015 was \$1,614, higher than the city's median rent of \$1.320.

#### Vehicles

- 33% of Fenway's households own at least one car, lower than the city average of 65%.
- The ratio of vehicles to households in Fenway was 0.33 in 2015, lower than the city ratio of 0.91.
